Alwyns Lane for another full season of football and entertainment in both League and, hopefully, extended runs in the FA Cup and FA Trophy. You never know, we might even lose a Surrey Senior Cup tie, actually on the park! home supporters will recognise the sarcasm seeing that we have not lost a game in that competition since 2nd December 2019.

As most will know, Mark Harper resigned as manager at the end of last season. We have put it on record, and happy to repeat in the publication, our thanks for his, and his back up team of Scott Tar, Andy Vine, Dave Reid, Shaun McAuley, Paul McCarthy and Heather Stead.

In consequence we welcome Josh Gallagher in charge of the dressing room with his team of Billy Bishop, Carl McAllister, Dan Canning Chris Williams, Toby Little (but will still be available to play) and Kevin Taylor. We have a raft of new players for a new look squad, including those returning to the colours.

There is continuity off the park with a couple exceptions. Barry Smith joins as a director. Will King is now the secretary, the first time such a transfer of post has taken place since 1977 and only the second since 1967, almost sixty years ago. He is also to be the COO which has an even broader remit. The plan is for all these changes to make Chertsey Town stronger, not only in the short term, but to project further in the future in a structured and sustainable manner.

For our first home game, we welcome everyone from Berkhamsted. They won promotion last season from Southern Division One Central after winning in the play-offs having been runners up. The club was founded in 2009 after Berkhamsted Town collapsed. Our more mature, shall we say, supporters will recall the original club. We have met Berko in its contemporary form, losing 2-0 to them in an FA Trophy tie in October 2020.

In addition to our regular first team fixtures at Alwyns Lane, Dial Square, in the Surrey Premier League continue their quest to join the ranks of the Combined Counties League. While on the subject of that competition, our association with Chertsey Town Juniors will be expanded this term as an Under 18 side will be playing here in the CCL on mid week evenings. More details will be forthcoming.

Although this programme edition is the first to be produced electronically, a full printed version will be available for our more prominent matches. We will also produce a basic hard copy team sheet/league table/fixtures and results

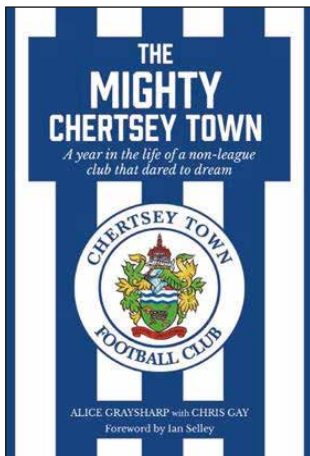

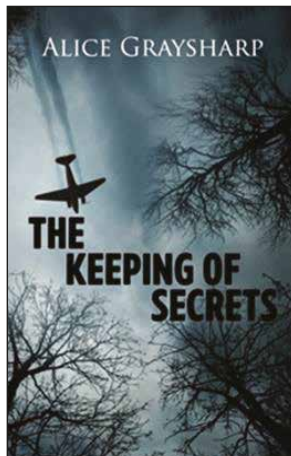

A VIEW FROM ALWYNS LANE

OVER THE PAST TWELVE MONTHS

MAY – We were basking in our championship winning season in the Isthmian League South Central Division and started to prepare for a new experience at Step Three.

JUNE – A large contingent of committee and team management attended the league presentation diner dance in Southampton. It was confirmed by then that the club would be playing in the Southern League Premier Division South.

JULY – player signing commenced in earnest that included Louis Birch, Callum Duffy, Alex Fisher, Gianluca Botti, Louis Degand, Nick Jupp, Conor Lee, Toby Little, Ollie McCoy, Jack Mazzone, Bill Montague, Luke Neville, Sam Ompreon, Wayne Ridgley, and Mason Welch-Turner. Football commenced with away trips to Virginia Water (at Slough Town) and Badshot Lea.

AUGUST – Our opening league game was a encouraging 4-1 win over Hungerford Town in front of 574 spectators. Our FA Cup commenced with a home 3-2 win over Raynes Park Vale. Reubin Collins, distracted by his participation in the TV series, Love Island (was 4th), signed up in the month. A severe collarbone injury sustained late in the month put Mason Welch-Turner out for the rest of the season

SEPTEMBER – FA Cup success against Hanwell Town and Ashford United saw the side reach the fourth qualifying round for only the second time ever. Isaac Olorumfermi signed from Bracknell Town.

OCTOBER – Our FA Cup run came to the end with the narrow defeat by Sutton United from two levels above. It was closer than the score suggested. our FA Trophy 'season' kicked off with a convincing win at Uxbridge. Meanwhile our league matches produced a mixed bag but we maintained our sixteenth place in the table. Merthyr Town led with Gloucester City following close behind. Simba Kudyiwa signed on the first day of the month.

NOVEMBER – This was a busy month with six league and two cup games played. The two cup ties were as different as chalk and cheese, but both resulted in away wins. We at last got to meet, then beat Camberley Town in the Surrey Senior Cup, but the biggie was our FA Trophy victory at National League South side Bath City. Cole Brown joined midway through the month.

DECEMBER – Our biggest scalp of the season was captured with our FA Trophy win over Dagenham & Redbridge by the only goal. That euphoria was only slightly tempered by league results when we only collected four points from five games, but still maintained a place in the top half of the table. Josh Strizovic came on loan from Dagenham & Redbridge to be our sixth goalkeeper of the season.

JANUARY - The eagerly awaited FA Trophy tie at Aldershot Town turned into an 8 – 0 disaster. It heralded a poor month of results with just one win. Two Saturdays were rained off, plus more failed attempts at getting Kingstonian to stage our Surrey Senior Cup tie. Sustained injuries were starting make an impact.

FEBRUARY - This was another poor month for we dropped eight places in the table to eighteenth having been unable secure a draw, let alone a win in the four outings. Combined with the previous month, we lost six successive games. Two more Saturday games went to the wall through the weather. Suspensions and those lengthy injuries provided a low spot. We were hanging on! There was one piece of positivity in that Liam Flanighan returned to football with us. Nathan Rogers also signed as a youth player still attached to Eastleigh. Ollie Turner also came as a youth, but from Aldershot Town, as did Leo Young from AFC Wimbledon. Luke Nevill departed to Bracknell Town.

MARCH – The tide began to turn. We had slipped two or three games behind rival sides which needed to be addressed. As a result, eight games were completed. Our three catch up games only yielded one point but our three wins elsewhere and that draw hauled us from a point away from the relegation zone to a four point cushion. Wayne Ridgley, having just served a three match ban, his third of the season, decided to move to Walton & Hersham. Seb Karczenwski joined from Hartley Wintney. Frustration led to the decision to withdraw from the Surrey Senior Cup. Patience with our opponents was exhausted, plus concentrating on the main goal, league survival with fit and fresh players, led to the withdrawal.

APRIL – With the first two games being wins, further upward progress in the league table led to a far more comfortable situation as the spectre of relegation receded. The atmosphere changed over the last three matches, all defeats against modest opposition but earlier results in the season ensured survival, even if it was by just one point.

WELCOME TO BERKHAMSTED

Berkhamsted FC was formed in 2009 after the demise of Berkhamsted Town, a long established club that collapsed midway through the 2008/09 season. The new 'Berkhamsted' was set up and allowed to move into the previous club's Broadwater home. The club nickname is the Comrades, after the name of the football club formed in the town by servicemen returning from the First World War 100 years ago.

Entry to the Spartan South Midlands League took effect immediately after formation. The side entered at Step 7 level and Division Two and won the title after scoring 121 goals in the 30 game competition. Twelve months on and the side were champions again, this time at the higher rated Division One, losing just once on the way. Promotion was thus made to the Premier Division which proved to be a bit tougher. Six reasonably good seasons were experienced before a promotion place was secured in 2018. This was done actually, in the runners up spot. The club was fortunate that term in that a reorganisation allowed two promotion places from Step 5 instead of the usual one.

Berkhamsted were placed in the Southern League and allocated a spot in the Central Division. They finished a creditable sixth in their first try but then Covid intervened. That season saw the side looking strong with 64 points won from their 28 games played up to the stoppage.

Berkhamsted's FA Vase career began in 2010. The furthest ventured was that done in the 2015/16 season when reaching the fifth round, but losing by

the odd goal of three to Northern League's Morpeth Town. FA cup adventures began in 2011. Four visits to the FA Trophy have been made. Last season the lost out to Hanwell Town on penalties.

Back with league action, The Comrades won promotion to the Southern League Premier Central in 2022 but the elevation proved to be too tough and the team, in finishing bottom of the table, returned to Division One Central. That set back has proven to be temporary as promotion back to Premier Division, South this time, came just twelve months later. The side were runners up but won through in the play-offs.

The original club of Berkhamsted Town had a distinguished career. After the Second World War they joined the Dephinian League which was eventually amalgamated under the three division (then) Athenian League. later they joined the Spartan League, the Isthmian League, then Southern League where it collapsed.

The club's greatest day must have come in 2001 when reaching the final of the FA Vase. The match with Taunton Town was played at Villa Park because Wembley was being reconstructed at that time. sadly, the side lost 2-1, but the whole nine match campaign must have given great satisfaction.



MEET THE BERKHAMSTED PLAYERS

Charlie Horlock - Joined Berko from Slough Town for whom he made 54 appearances last season. started his career with Wycombe Wanderers then played 273 games at Hitchin Town

Jack Tompkins - A right back, who has racked up 80 games in his two spells at Berko. Jack started his career at Barnet and earned a move to Banbury United, but injury eventually ruled him out there.

Pierce Mitchell - A centre half just joined from Frome Town where he made 90 appearances Has played most of his career at Step 3, but has moved back to his home town..

Charlie Johnson - Another centre half, who joined last November 2024. Former clubs include Cambridge United, St. Ives and Royston Town.

Max Rosner - A young centre back who joined in October 2024. Had previously played for Hemel Hempstead, Bedford Town and AFC Dunstable.

James Gurteen – Newley joined from Harrow Borough. Has also played at Rayners Lane and Bracknell Town.

Kwadwo Kyei - A left back who came on board this summer. Has played at Hertford Town, AFC Dunstable and Slough Town, before joining the Comrades.

Cameron Hyde - An experienced wide player, with over 250 senior appearances. Came from Barton Rovers but has also played at Chesham, Bedford, Kempston and Biggleswade United.

Adam Watkins - A veteran midfielder with over 100 appearances at the cb and 400 more elsewhere including Luton Town, Kidderminster Harriers, Eastleigh, Bedford Town, Royston Town, Chesham United and Cambridge City.

Luke Andrews – A stalwart with over 150 senior appearances in Berko's midfield. Previously with Biggleswade Town.

Charlie Barker - 26 year old midfielder, who started at Leyton Orient. Has since played at Braintree and St.Neots, before joining Berko in January 2025.

Darnell Goather-Braithwaite - Young winger who joined from Potters Bar. Previously with Waltham Abbey, Kingstonian, and Hemel Hempstead.

Michael Harding - A summer acquisition. A striker from Flackwell Heath. Started his career at Northampton Town. Has also played at Kettering Town, St.Ives and Barwell.

Brad Wadkins – In his second stint with the Comrades; an attacking midfielder. A regular goal scorer in his career of 400 games. Most of those goals came with Chesham, Slough Town and Welwyn Garden City,

Jonathan Lacey – Has scored over 200 goals in his 350+ senior appearances. More than 100 of those have been for Berkhamsted,

Matt Bateman - Holder of the club record for goals in one season with 44 in 2018/19. Another striker with over 400 games and approaching 200 goals. Most of those have been scored for Berkhamsted and Royston Town.

Bernard Christie – A front man, with overall 272 goals from 454 senior appearances. Most came at AFC Dunstable, Returned to the club last season.

Cyrus Babaie - The final signing this summer. The striker has played previously at Welwyn, Biggleswade Town, Kettering and Redditch United.

TIVERTON TOWN 0 CHERTSEY TOWN 2

We began our second Southern League Premier Division quest in the self proclaimed, God's own Country! The initial goal was achieved for us to return to base happy. Even the greatly delayed rail journey home did not dampen spirits as our fellow passengers confirmed. In a much changed side, only three of last season's squad featured in the starting line-up, with another one joining off the bench to make his mark. There were two down sides to the afternoon. The first was the playing surface which was far from the standard expected at Step 3 level. It greatly affected the style and quality of performance, but not the desire. The other distraction was the last minute dismissal of Jermaine Green for an alleged stamping which has yet to be verified, subtle as the incident appeared to be from the touchline. It did not distract from an overall air of satisfaction as an unassailable two goal lead had already been justly established.

A sunny warm day, with us appropriately kitted out in a tropical all white strip, rained down on the arid pitch with only a stiff Devonian breeze to temper the heat. It ran lengthways along the park but did not seem significant until the second half when George Burton, the home goalkeeper, frequently hooked or shanked long clearances out into touch, as if done by a mediocre golfer off the tee. It did have some effect as the home side relied on long, and seemingly, hope for the best results in order to bypass the ordeal of harnessing the lacklustre sward. It summed up Tiverton's wayward second half performance who were put to the sword by our ambitions. We too struggled to exploit our main weapon of choice, incisive passing across the deck.

The first half was evenly balanced. We won the majority of corner kicks and midfield control, but our hosts squandered the best chances, with miskicks in favourable situations spoiling their finishing. The first came on 16 minutes when the ball was flashed close in, across our goalmouth. It created a comical hokey-pokey moment with flailing legs from both sides failing to connect. A Josh Gallagher strike from outside the box nine minutes later looked more professional, especially when Burton tipped the ball over his cross bar. Another scramble in the visitors' goalmouth came just two minutes later but the ball was never to be tamed until a decisive lunging clearance was achieved.

The return of wide man Gary Abisogun was felt by the home side, to eventually police him with two markers. It forced their team manager to do this after dangerous moves were created on the left, as illustrated on the half hour with a cross to Bill Montague that was sent narrowly wide. The opening half concluded with another Tiverton chance when the ball was

lobbed out wide for Aiden Horne to advance unimpeded into our penalty area. The advantage was converted into a corner kick as new goalkeeper Luke Wynne-Roberts justified his signing by blocking the shot away off course.

Tiverton's second half performance could not be repeated with our efforts smothering their attack. We still had to rely on the long ball pass, but was done after setting up favourable situations by a dominant midfield. An Abisogun shot was blocked after just one minute of second half play to generate successive corner kick dangers. An awkward Monague volley from ten yards only two minutes later emphasised our ascendancy. Next, a moment came with 53 minutes on the clock as Abisogun tried to find the top corner of the Yellow's net from 15 yards, following one of the more attractive approach movements. A Jordan Gallagher cross set up another corner kick as pressure increased. However, it was a nick over the top through the middle for Jack Mazzone to develop and slot home almost on the hour that set us on towards the three points.

The game continued to be marred with a plethora of miskicks, not always sponsored by the playing surface, but our defence was now secure so there was to be no more heartache moments. The 72nd minute saw Green come on for Mazzone to create a 15 minute cameo session that saw him set up an assist for the second goal as well as the late dismissal. It proved to be a memorable debut for him! Ollie McCoy also came off the bench for Montague and soon made an impact with a shot, powerful maybe, but it went straight at the 'keeper. However, he was not to be outdone in converting the Green assist, a cross from the right on 79 minutes, by heading the ball home from six yards whilst being flanked by two ineffective defenders. The cushion created was enough for a comfortable conclusion to a competitive, if not entirely cultured, contest.

The same could be said for the 401 spectators who thankfully had missed the earlier rain that had toned up an already superbly presented playing surface. Almost all of our new squad had a run out with major changes made at half time and midway through the second half.

Two curling efforts from outside the box from Garry Abisogun and Jordan Gallagher respectively did not quite arc in enough but provided the nearest moment we came before the interval. Previously was with Chipstead where he made 35 appearances in season 2023/24. **Eion Casey** (34) Enjoyed seven seasons at Chesham United, making 197 appearances with 26 goals for the Generals in that time. Was part of their 2023/24 championship winning side that took the club into National League South. Had a loan spell at Alwyns Lane last season which was cut short by injury.

Alex Fisher (28) Was at the Queens Park Rangers academy for over six years, when very young. Played at Metropolitan Police for the 22/23 season, joining the Curfews in the 2023 close season. A defender. **Jordan Gallagher** (28) A striker with 117 goals scored in the last four seasons, helping Raynes Park Vale to Step 4, and contributing goals to Farnham Town's Isthmian South Central title winning 2024/25 season. **Archie Harland-Goddard** (25) A right back who joined in the summer from Redhill. Moved then to Chesham United where he helped to cement their place at Step 2 last season. **Ollie McCoy** (27) Signed as an attacker in October 2023 where he had a brief spell at Ascot United.
